Purpose-

To encourage diversity in programming by groups wanting to form, the current group program was implemented with expectations and criteria for success clearly defined.

Each year, groups must meet set criteria to be recognized by the Alumni Association. Completion of these requirements must be met between July 1 and June 30. The staff liaison for a group, with the group's leadership, keeps track throughout the year of activity as it occurs.

Like the members who compose it, each alumni group will take on its own unique personality which will be reflected in the groups' interests. Examples of affinity groups include; reunions, sororities/fraternities, musical groups, etc. Regardless of the personality there will be the common themes in each Alumni Group:

- Creating ways for alumni to network and meet each other in their communities.
- Renewing friendships developed at Wittenberg and creating new friendships within the community.

Supporting the efforts of the University to keep alumni informed of campus developments.

How to start an Alumni Group:

- 1. Form an initial core planning team. Each group should have at least 3-5 members willing to serve as the core planning group. As the group matures, the group may decide to formalize leadership and identify group officers.
- 2. **Plan**. The core planning committee or Group leadership meets and prepares a draft calendar of potential events. One event per quarter is recommended.

 - i. How to start
 - ii. Checklist of responsibilities
- 3. Host the kick-off event. This will usually be a virtual event with the exception of reunions. The Alumni Relations Team will send event notifications and host an electronic registration page on your behalf.
