

INTRODUCTION TO 2016 GRADUATE SURVEY



Graduates of the Class of 2016 were surveyed throughout the past year by Wittenberg Career Services using The Outcomes Survey online tool, as used by the National Association of Colleges and Employers (NACE) and facilitates easier reporting for national statistical data collection. As noted in the previous years' Graduate Survey, this is a more in-depth survey than in the history of Career Services' reports, which can be seen online.

In keeping with the high placement rates of past Wittenberg University graduates, for the Class of 2016 we have a placement rate of 98.4% as defined by the number of those working full-time, enrolled in a post-baccalaureate program, or military service, and 4% of the respondents seeking employment (based on survey answers, they may be currently employed but desire other positions). The median salary for Wittenberg Undergraduates was \$35,500, which is lower than the average salary of graduates of that year and for the previous year, but is also compared to graduates with non-Liberal Arts degrees. Of the graduates reporting, 18.5% indicated salaries between \$40,000 – to \$49,000 and 23.4% indicated salaries between \$50,000 - \$79,000. At the time of this report, we had an overall knowledge rate of 40.26%; this percentage is from direct response from the past graduates only, without input from validated secondary sources (at this time). Additional input can be added at later dates from verified sources. Of those responding to the questions, the report highlights include 82.2% indicated they were very satisfied or satisfied with their career status and 92.8% reported completing an experiential learning experience beyond the required Community Service requirement.

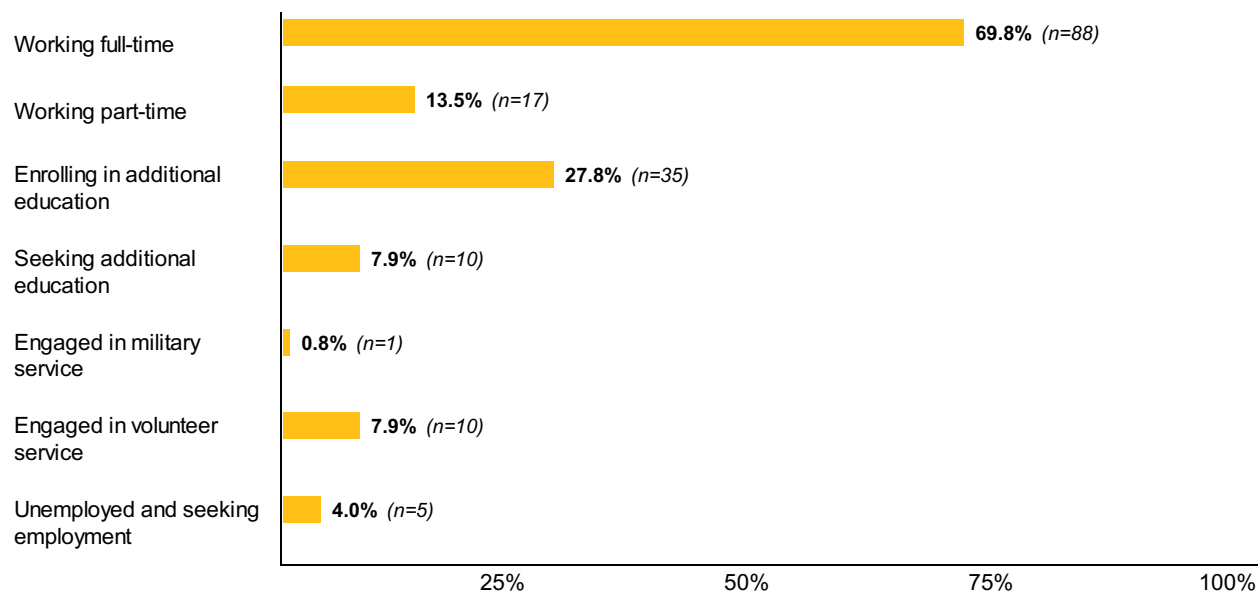

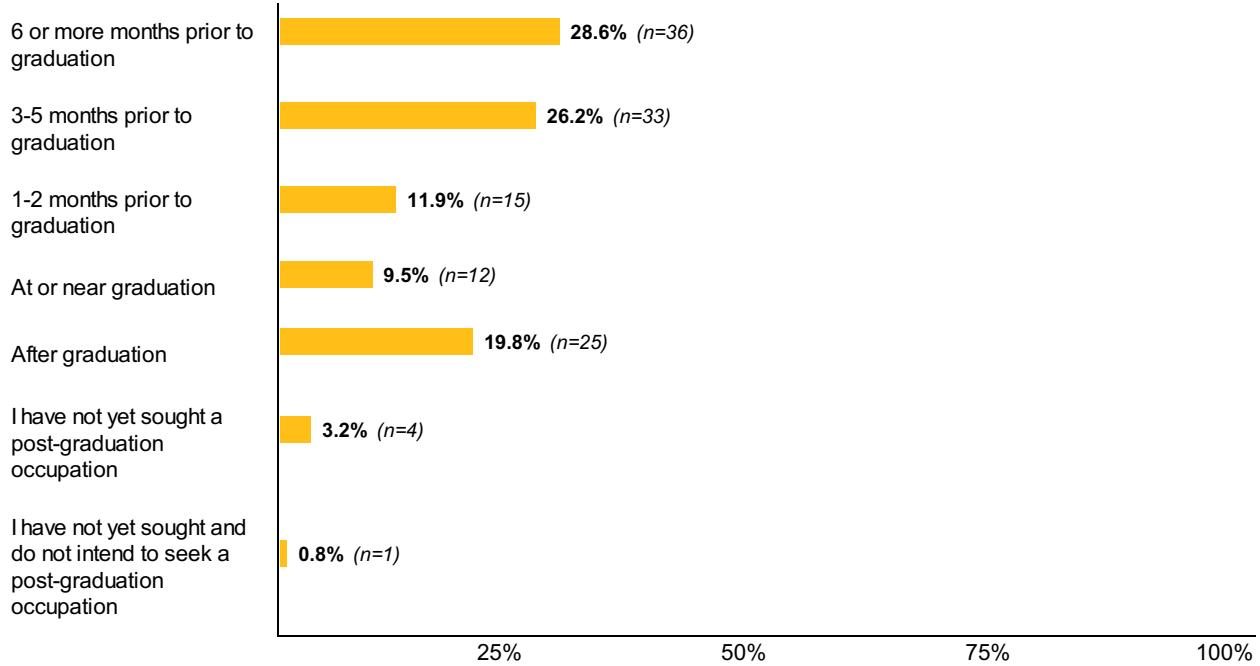

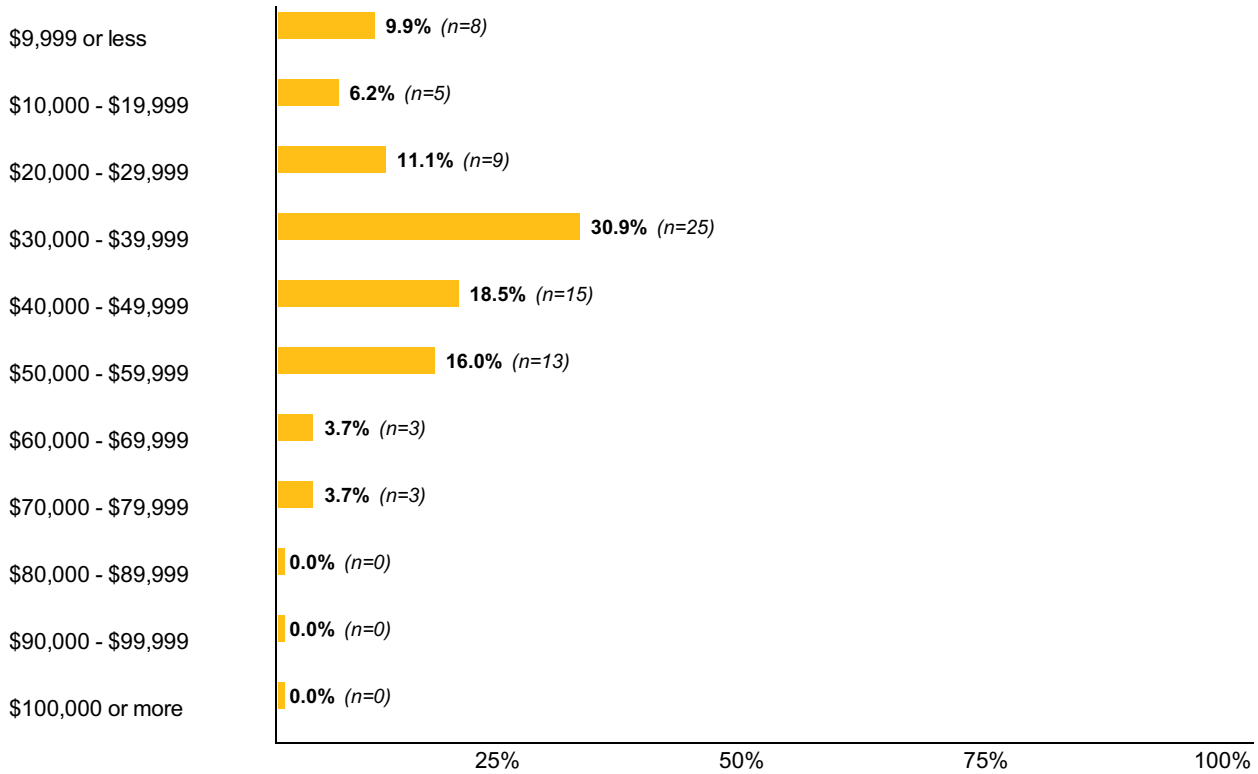

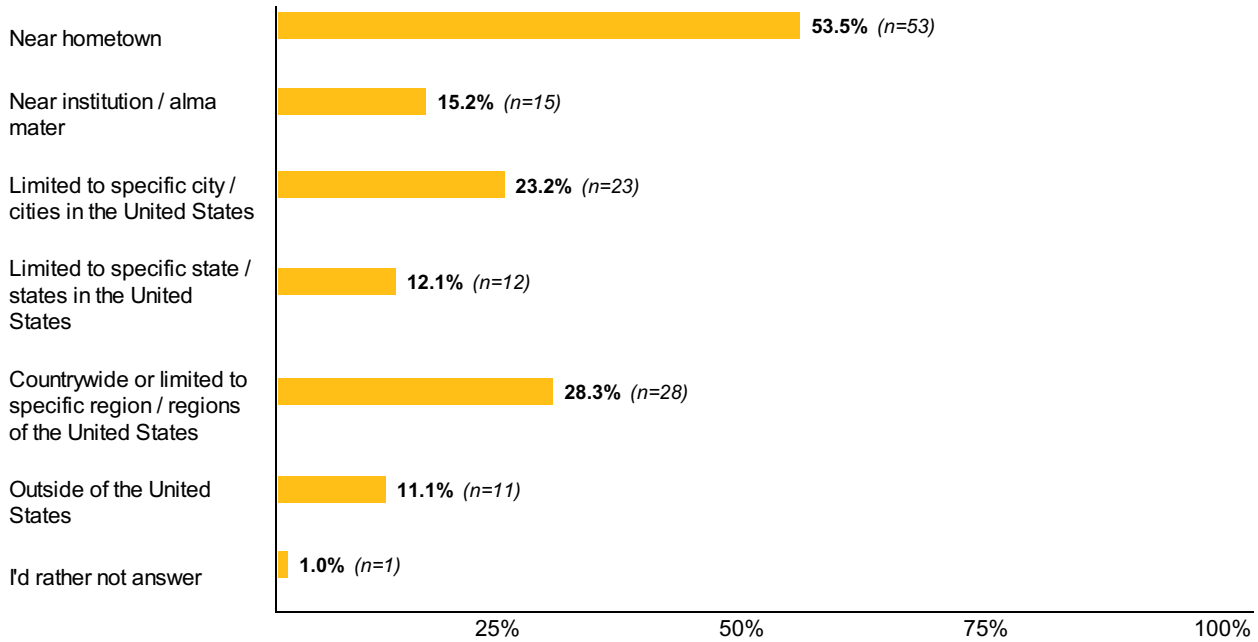

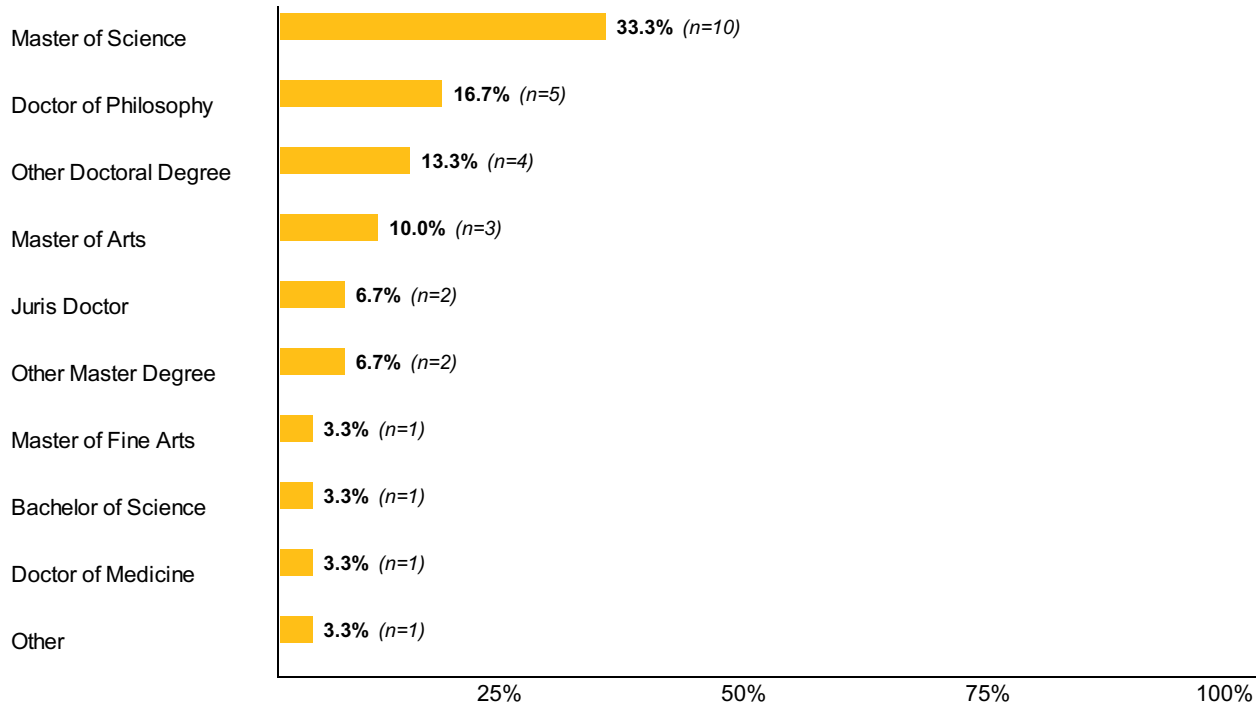

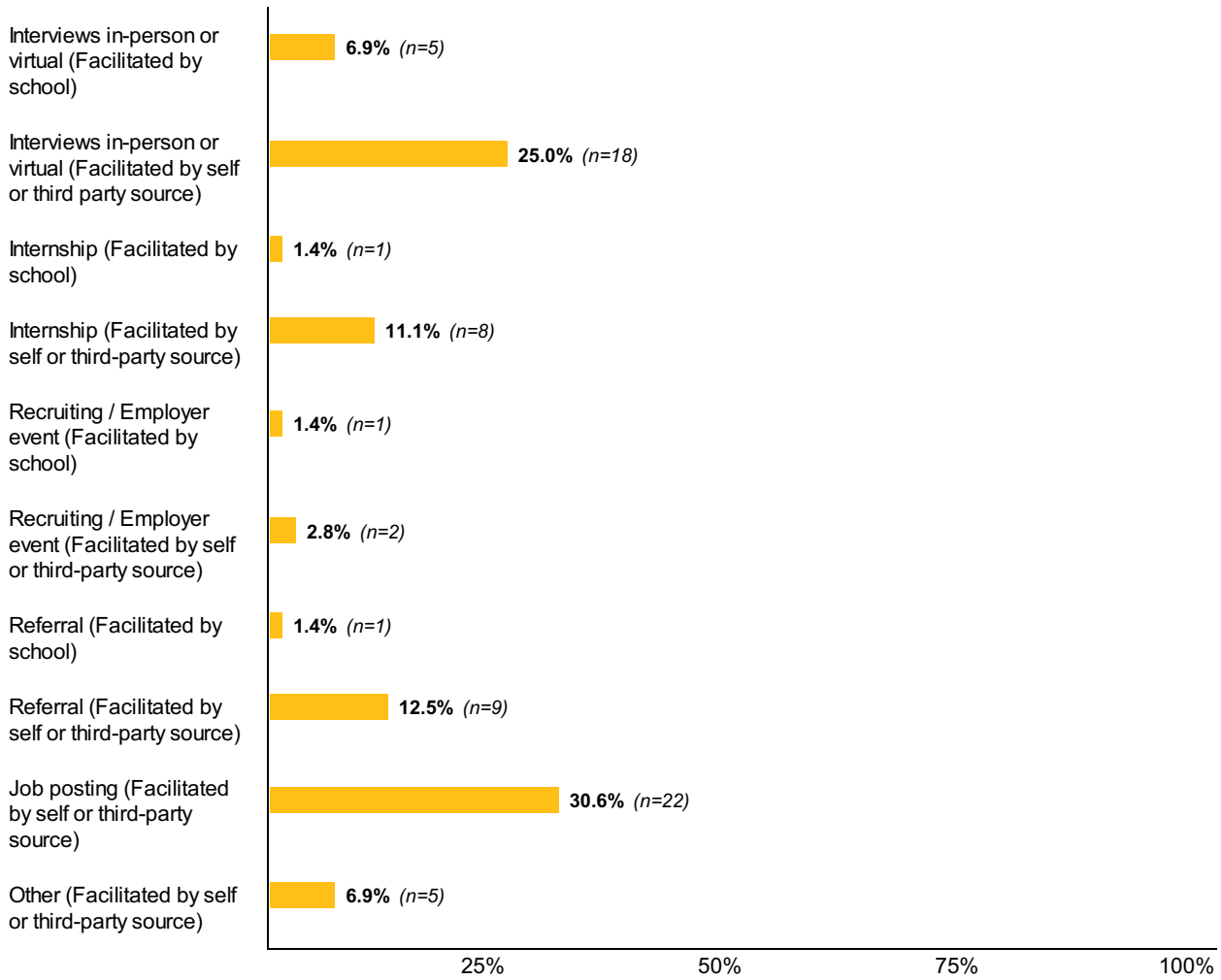

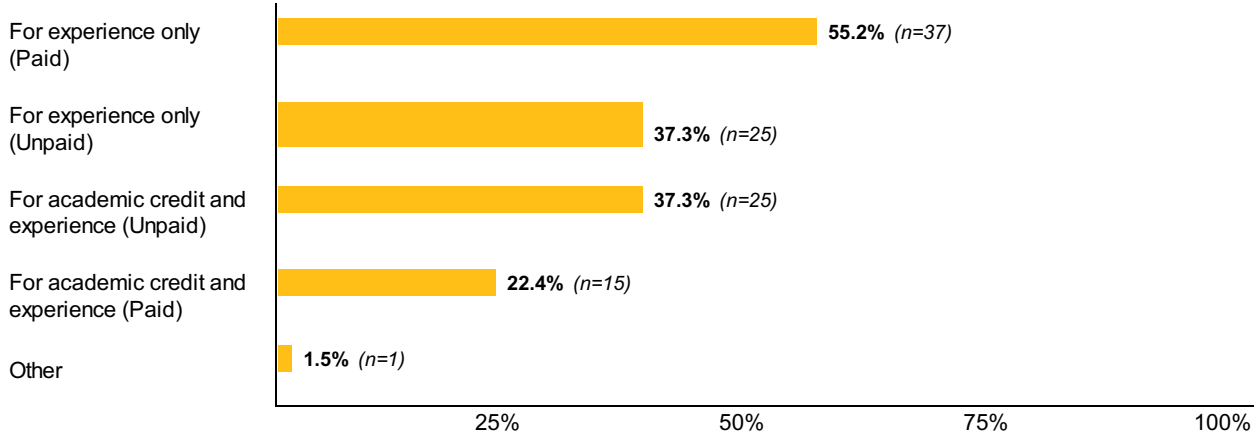

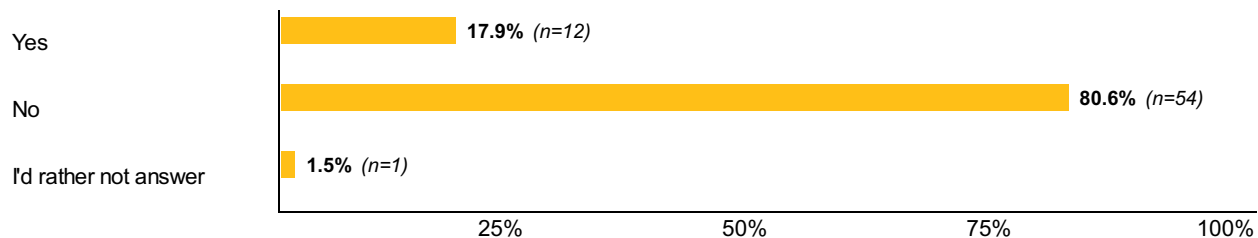

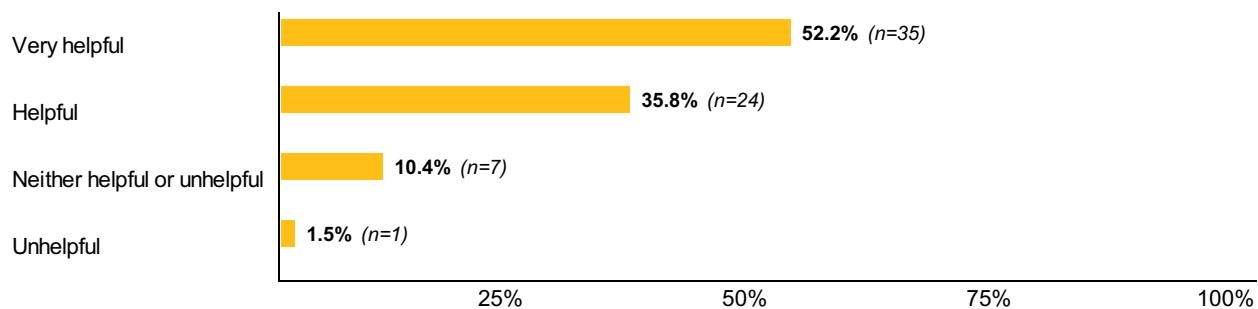

Experiential 55: Overall, how helpful were your internships in preparing you for the workplace/your career?

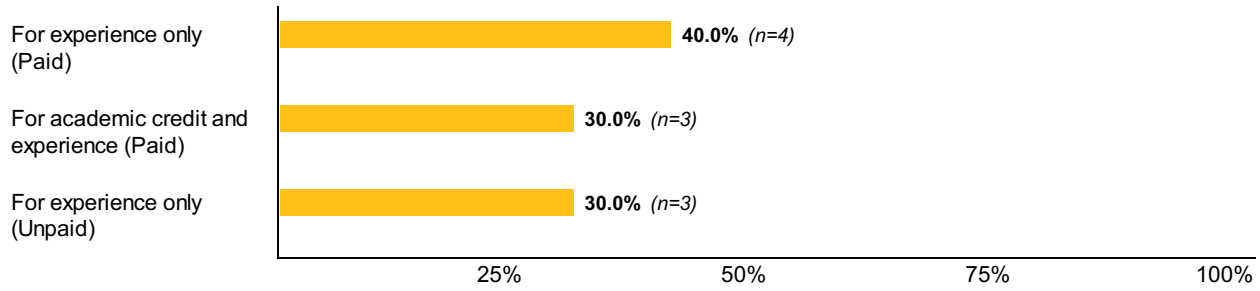

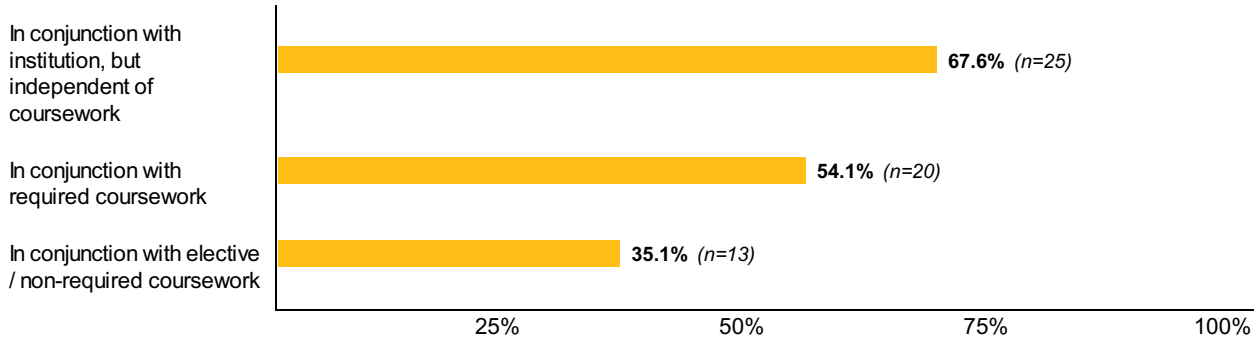

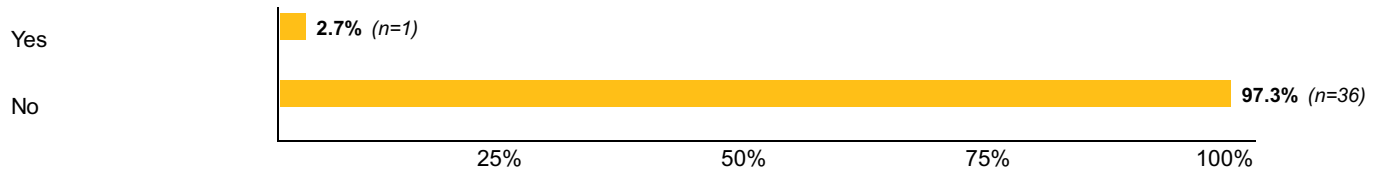

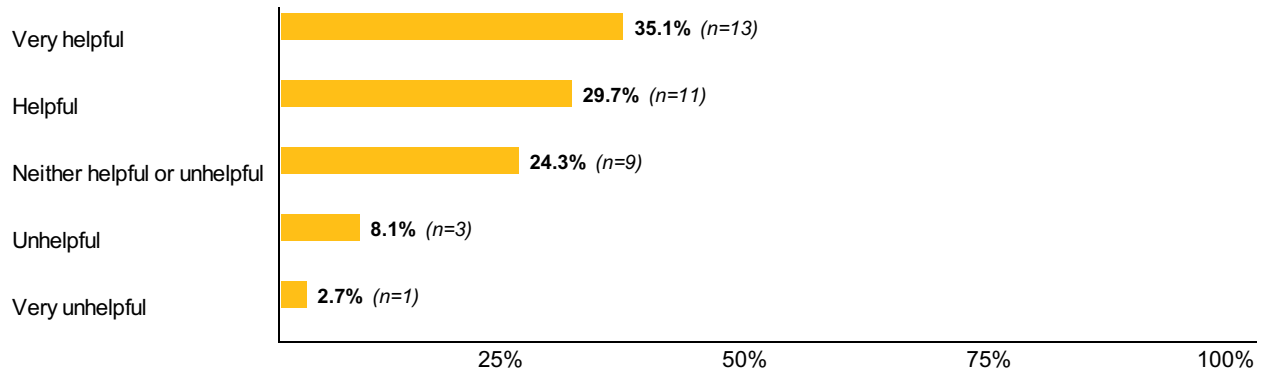

Experiential 69: How helpful were your service learning or other academic volunteer experiences in preparing you for the workplace/your career?

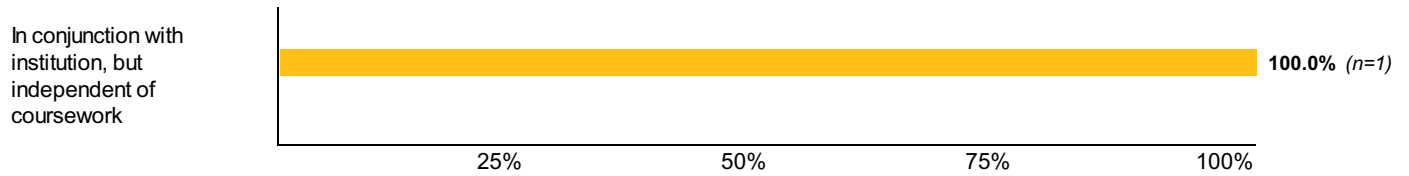

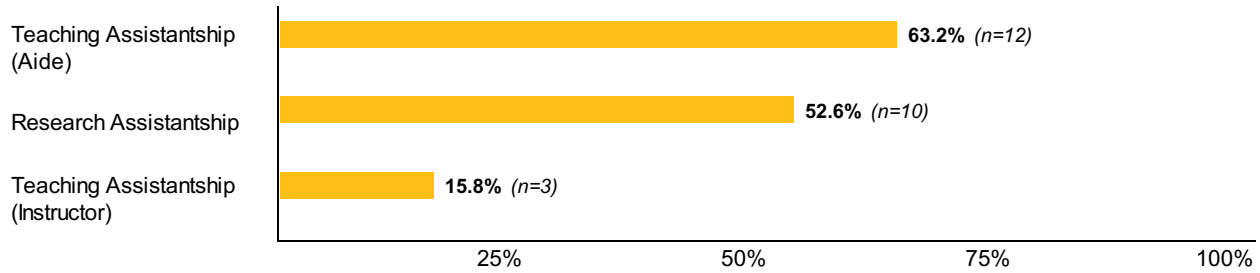

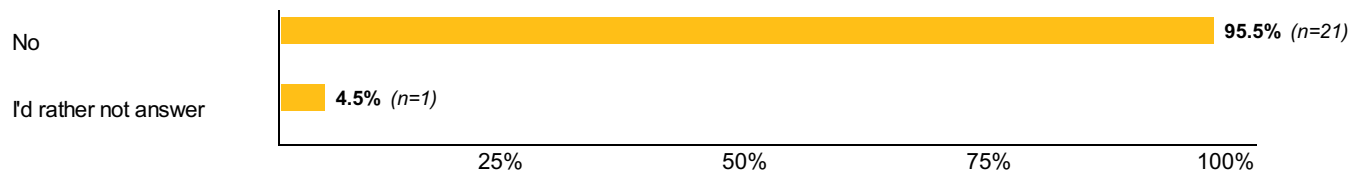

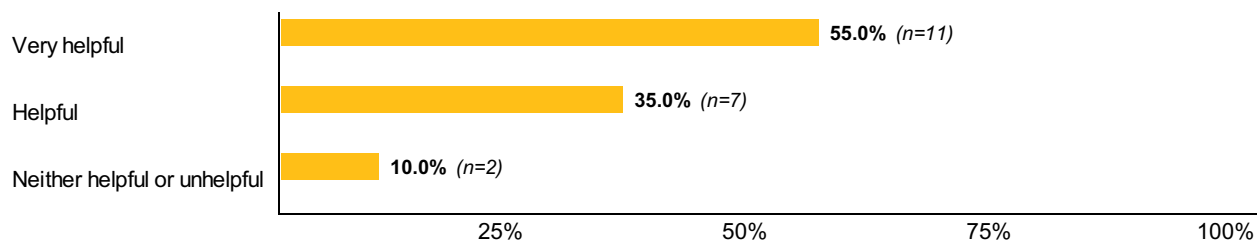

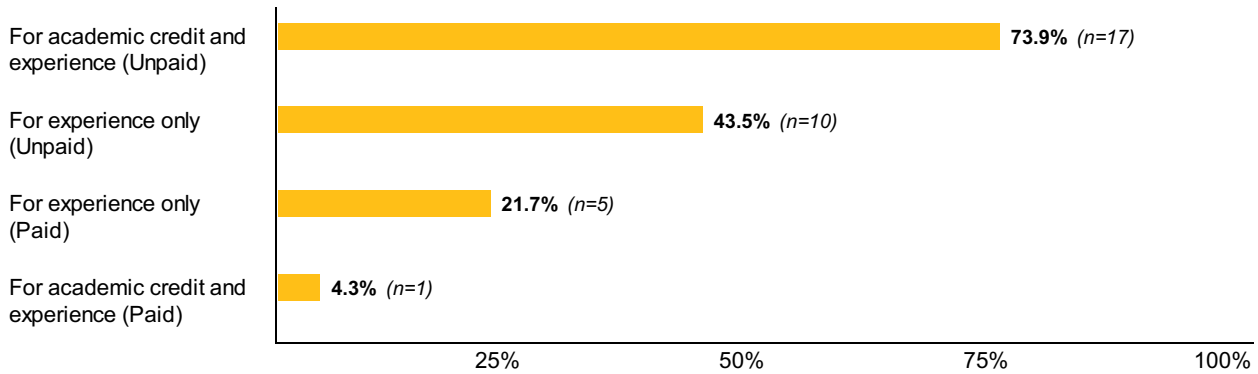

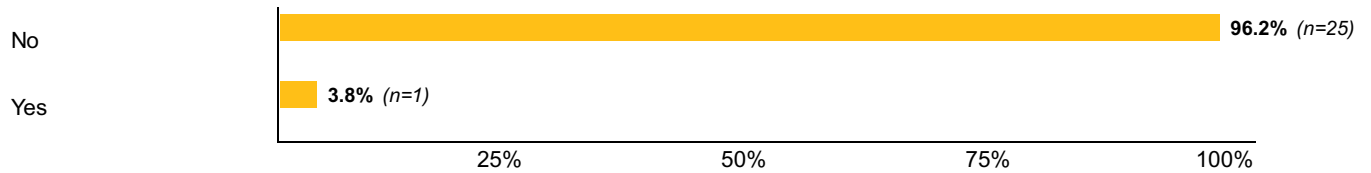

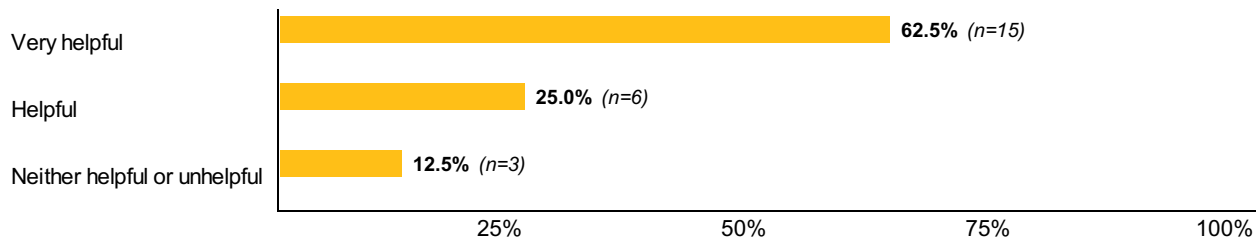

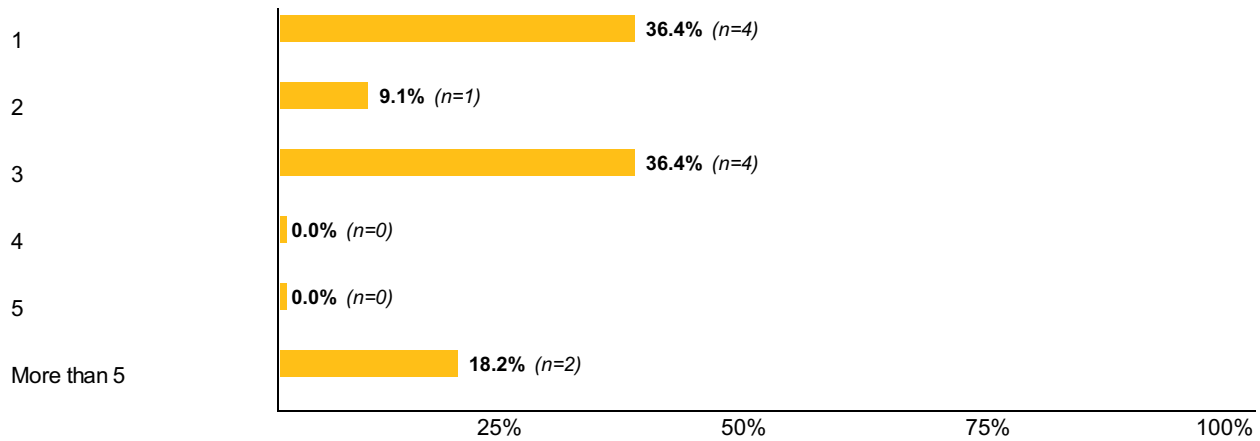

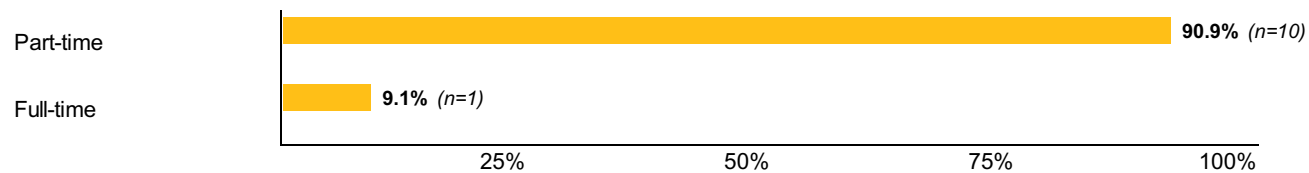

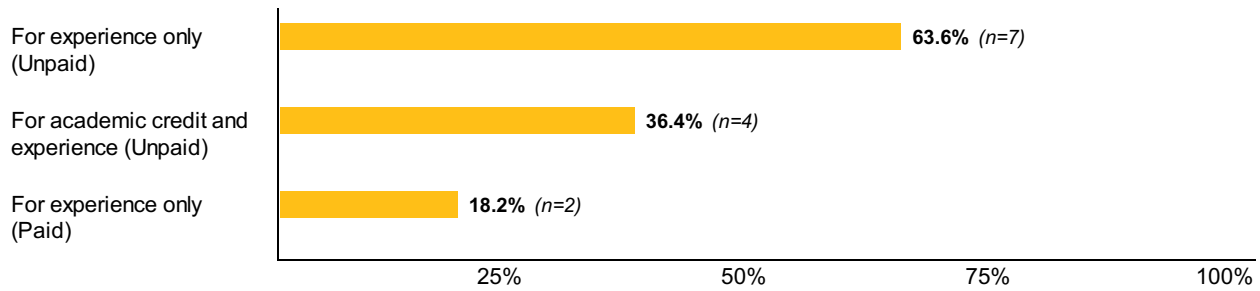

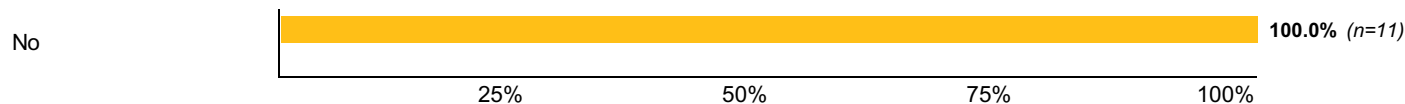

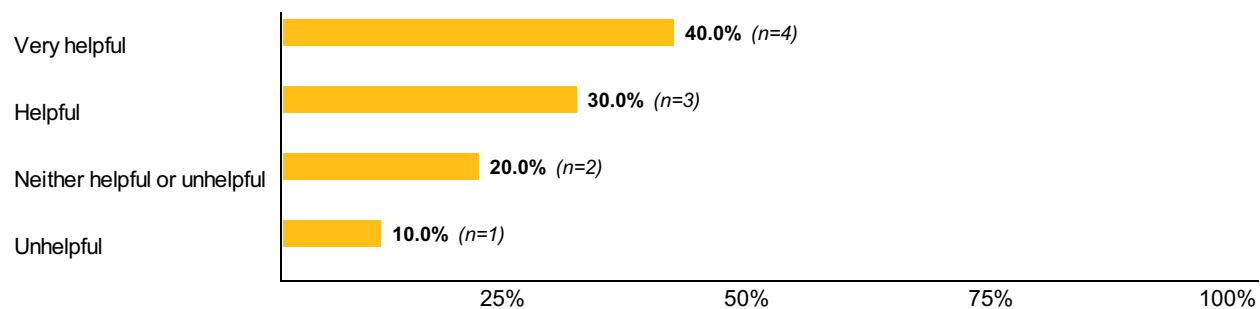

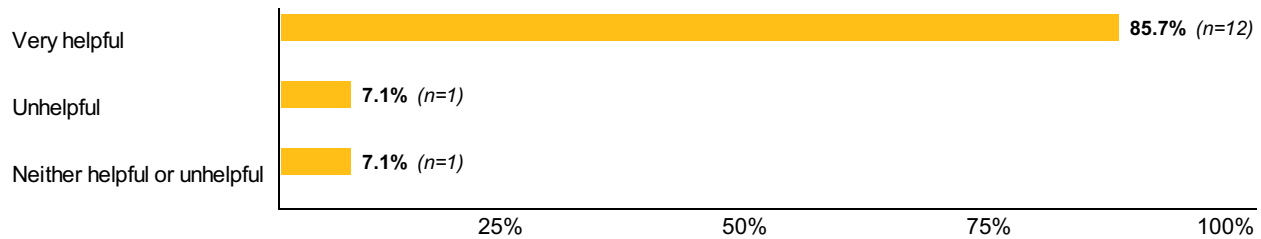

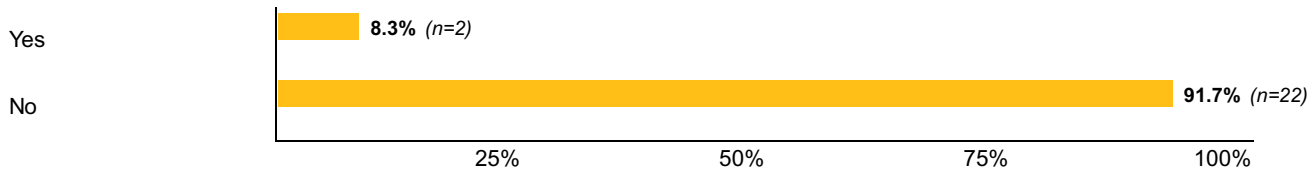

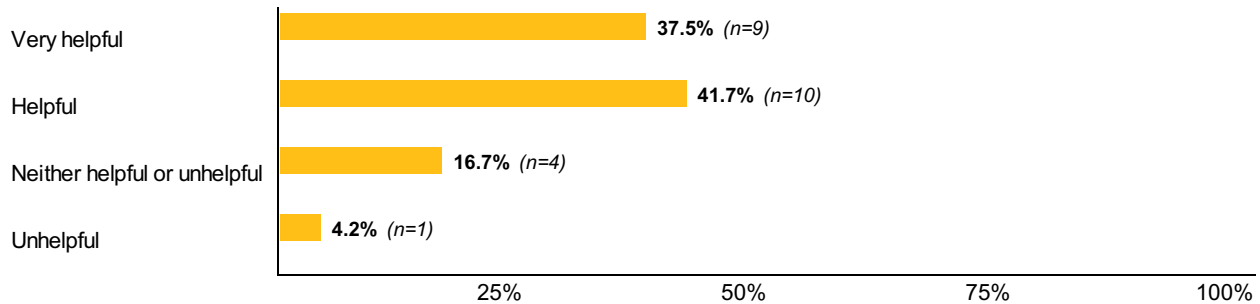

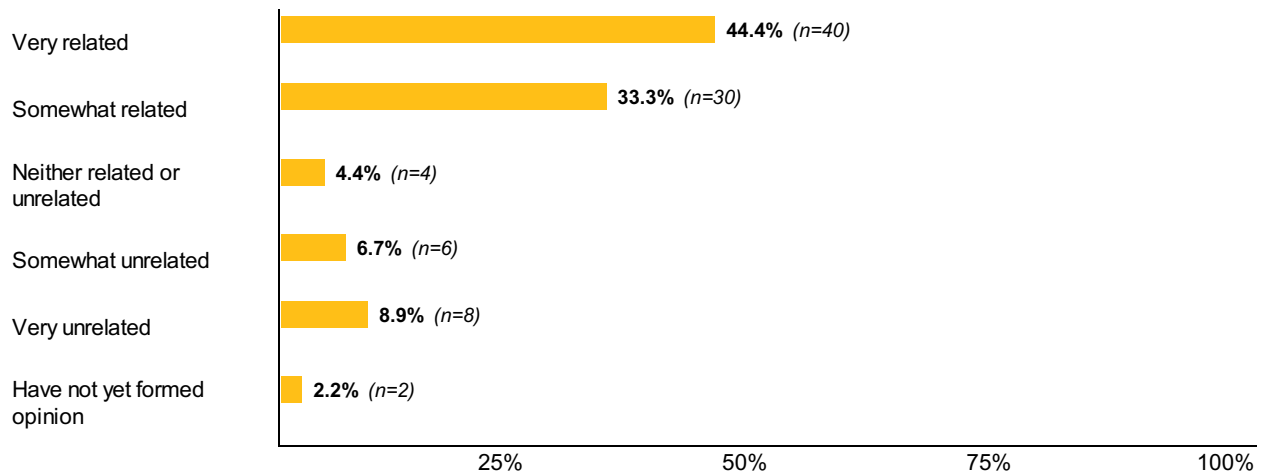

Satisfaction 105: How related is your reported primary post-graduation occupation to your program/area of study?

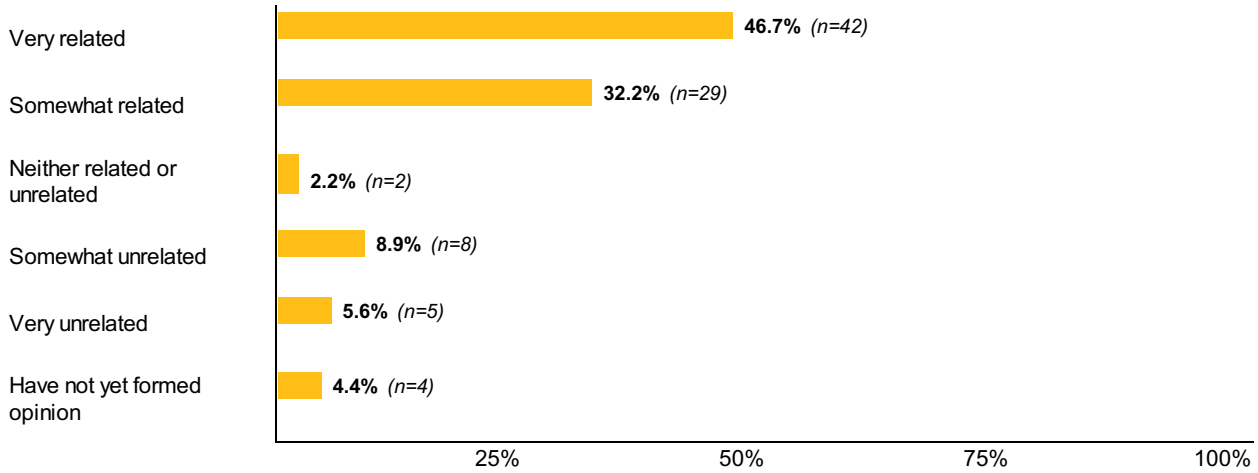

Satisfaction 106: How related is your reported primary post-graduation occupation to your career goals?

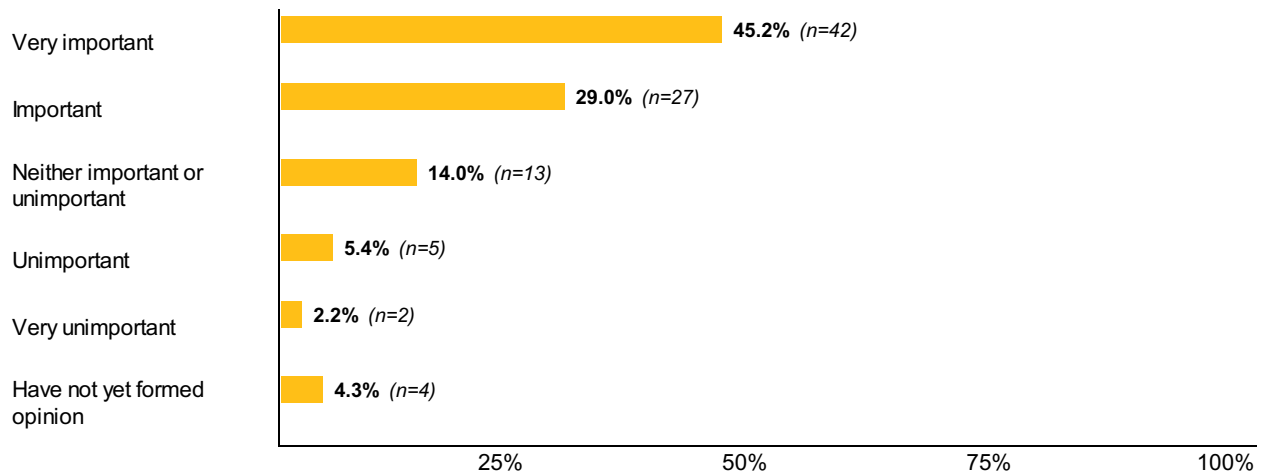

Satisfaction 107: How important to you is it that your reported primary post-graduation occupation or career is related to your program/area of study?

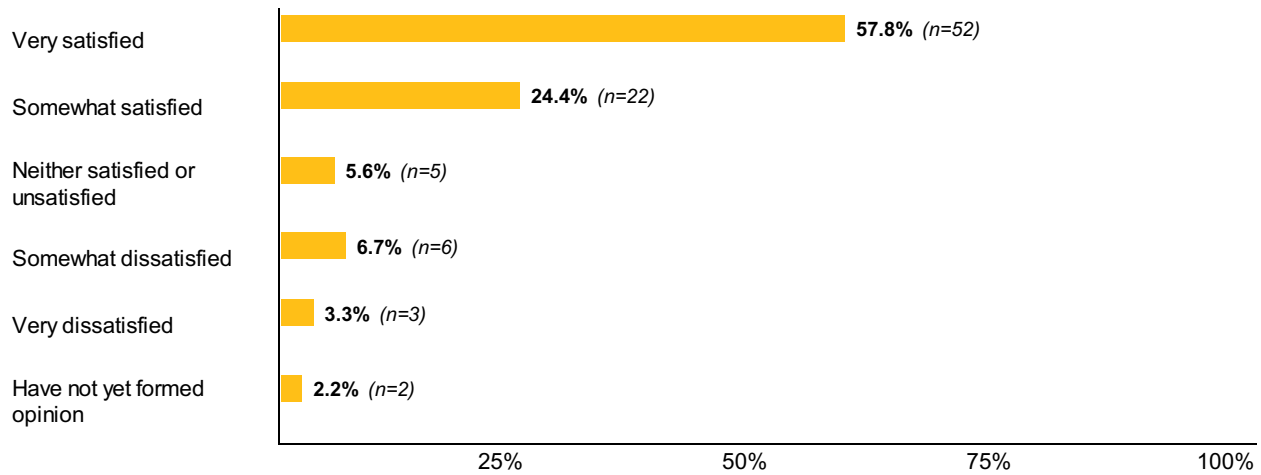
