Prior to being admitted to the Teacher Education Program, the student must meet all of the admission requirements outlined in the Undergraduate Teacher Education Handbook for Licensure, including demonstration of mathematical competency by earning a grade of C- or higher in a 4-credit course that fulfills the LO #4 Connections Curriculum requirement.	

Requirements for Adolescent Young Adult Licensure:

- All courses must be passed with a grade of C- or above. See the Academic Catalog for additional requirements for admission and continuation in the program. Courses may not be offered every year. Check the department schedules for course offerings.
- Students are required to complete a capstone assessment, the edTPA, during their Student Teaching Seminar (EDUC-496) and earn a C- or higher in the course.
