Major:	Satisfactory completion of a major in Spanish (36 credits beyond the 100 level) as described below plus additional course and academic work as required for Ohio licensure (43-50 credits). For purposes of teacher licensure with a major in Spanish, the requirements on this advising sheet must be met.  Wittenberg requires all foreign-language teacher candidates to complete the Oral Proficiency Interview (OPI) and the Writing Proficiency Test (WPT) as recommended by the American Council of Teaching Foreign Languages (ACFTL) organization. Education:	Satisfactory completion of a minor in education (32 credits) as described below. Prior to being admitted to the Teacher Education Program, the student must meet all of the admission requirements outlined in the Undergraduate Teacher Education Handbook for Licensure, including demonstration of mathematical competency by earning a grade of C- or higher in a 4-credit course that fulfills the LO #4 Connections Curriculum requirement.			

## Requirements for Multi-age Licensure

- All courses must be passed with a grade of C- or above. See the Academic Catalog for additional requirements for admission and continuation in the program. Courses may not be offered every year. Check the department schedules for course offerings.
- Students are required to complete a capstone assessment, the edTPA, during their Student Teaching Seminar (EDUC-496) and earn a C- or higher in the course.
