- II. Officer Reports/Goals: (10 minutes)
 - a. Gardner, President
 - i. Waiting on a response from Witt PD concerning "Smash-a-Car" event.

 - Let's reach out to community members to see if they would be interested in participating in this event, and come back to the next meeting with whether this is feasible. (Gardner)
 - Push back this paneling event until at minimum after FIRE Week and Spring break in order to ensure that there is enough time to plan the event and get more than just Dr. Taylor on the panel. (Gardner)
 - Because we will be pushing this panel back, let's try to have some other form of tabling take place during this time instead. Maybe have a table set up outside of CDR during the dinner rush. (Gardener)

- c. Kuzilwa, Treasurer
 - i. Creating incentives for students to join Student Senate
 - Talked with Kristina Bryant (Director of Student Conduct and Deputy Title IX Coordinator) about the potential of Student Senators having priority access to select housing properties in the annual housing lottery.
 - a. Kristina has greenlit this idea to be presented to Gwen Owens (Associate Dean of Students and Director of Resident Life).
 - 2. Talked with Katie Simms (Director for Student Programming and Organizations) about Student Senate executive members getting paid for their work for Student Senate.
 - a. This would be done with the intention of requiring all executive members to have been on Student Senate for at least a term prior, to always have competition for general body member positions who would have that potential of getting paid for their work.

If Student Senate decides to look at this potential again, it should look over those previous documents and develop a plan for how Student Senate can step up and justify getting paid. (Gill)

 - i. Beginning in Fall 2024, the faculty has voted to approve the following changes to class times: (*FEB attachment 1*)
 - 1. Faculty voted to increase Monday, Wednesday, Friday classes from 50 minutes to 60 minutes.
 - 2. Faculty voted to increase Tuesday and Thursday classes from 75 minutes to 90 minutes.

- a. These changes are being made to reduce the number of outside of class assignments from 700 minutes per semester to 250 minutes per semester.

h. Lightner, Diversity —

- i. MLK Convocation was overall a success in the sense that a lot of students and community members attended the event, however there have been some concerns that have been brought up since:
 - 1. Problems with the way President Frandsen carried himself during the event, specifically on stage. He looked uninterested in what the speakers had to say.
 - According to Gill, it was extremely hard for the individuals sitting behind the speakers to hear what they had to say, so President Frandsen may have been trying to hear them better but Gill will talk with him about these concerns regardless. (Gill)
 - i. Moving forward, having the IT department test all specific seats in the area to ensure things can be heard is important, and if speakers want to sit during a convocation, we need to move the

podium back so that they can been seen more easily by those in attendance.

- 2. Some students who were involved in the procession had issues with organizers of the event who (intentionally or not) were using microaggressions and talking down to Black and Brown students when providing a breakdown of the event.
 - a. This was done through over-explaining every facet of the event as if the students were toddlers and because this specific concern was brought by multiple Black and Brown students it was seen as targeted.
 - b. This may have been unintentional, but the way it was presented was unclear to the students.
 - c. Follow up with these students to get more information about what happened, and formalized statements. (Lightner)
