

### **Self-Design Proposal**

Do you have an interest in completing your service with a site that is not on this list? One expectation of the CCUE 100 experience is for students to serve in the Springfield/Clark County community and with non-profit organizations that are in partnership with the Hagen Center for the CCUE 100 course. If a student wants to serve with a non-partner site, then they need to submit a Self-Design proposal for approval. The experience must meet the guidelines for CCUE 100 and allow the student to achieve the desired outcomes of CCUE 100. In reviewing the proposal, consideration will be given to a student's circumstances and the site's connection to those guidelines.
