Math Workshop: Increase your understanding of math, physics, chem, econ, stats, comp sci, accounting, or education.



Working with local nonprofit partners, the students involved in our paid Summer Internship Program boost their confidence in their ability to effect change.


Countless Ways to Shine






Witt Traditions





Scholarship & Aid Opportunities

Merit Scholarships

Wittenberg assigns merit awards at the time of admission based on your overall GPA or optional SAT or ACT test score. These awards are renewable for four years so long as you maintain Satisfactory Academic Progress and enroll as a full-time undergraduate student.

Special Interest & Fine Arts Awards

Students may also earn either one Special Interest Scholarship, for work in areas such as leadership and civic engagement, or one Fine Arts Scholarship. These are renewable awards.

First Year Research Awards

Students selected for the highly competitive First Year Research awards will work closely with a faculty member while pursuing exciting research opportunities right from the start of their time at Wittenberg.

We encourage you to file a FAFSA each year before the priority deadline of February 15 to be considered for needbased funding. Our FAFSA code is 003143.

great reasons to file the FAFSA

- **1. Strong aid packages:** Students who file the FAFSA typically receive more financial assistance from Wittenberg than those who choose not to file.
- **2. Most income ranges qualify:** By filing the FAFSA, you can access grants, scholarships, work-study programs, and low-interest loans, regardless of your family's income, ensuring you have the financial support to pursue your educational dreams.
- 3. It's free, as always, and faster than ever: File online via studentaid.gov and use the IRS Data Retrieval tool to upload your federal tax information. You'll save time and effort!

Take a Trip to Witt for your \$5,000 Visit Scholarship!

Students who visit campus through the Office of Admission for either a campus tour or an event before January 1, 2026, will be eligible to earn a Visit Scholarship of \$1,250 a year for four years for a total of \$5,000. This is a stackable award and can be combined with other scholarships.

Stackable Scholarship Opportunities

These scholarships can be stacked on top of other awards, as noted below. They are awarded at the time of admission based on information received in your admission materials.

*Students can only receive one of these awards.

Sibling/Legacy Recognition (\$1,250/year for \$5,000 total):

For admitted students whose sibling or step-sibling is a currently enrolled undergraduate degree-seeking student, or graduated from Wittenberg, or have a parent, grandparent or step-parent who is a Wittenberg alumni.*

Lutheran Promise Scholarship (\$1,250/year for \$5,000 total): For admitted students who are active members in a Lutheran church. Information regarding church membership must be included in your admission application.*

Referral Scholarship (\$1,250/year for \$5,000 total): For admitted students who are referred by a Wittenberg alum before January 1.*

Valedictorian/Salutatorian Recognition Scholarship (\$1,250/year for \$5,000 total): For admitted students who are ranked one or two in their class or named Valedictorian or Salutatorian of their graduating class at the time of admission. Determination is based on high school transcript.

PTK Transfer Award (\$2,000/year for \$8,000 total): Phi Theta Kappa members can receive this award in addition to receiving one of the three stackable scholarships listed above, as well as the stackable Visit Award.
