

Coach's Corner

Greetings from Springfield! With the 2024 season wrapped up, this is a good time to catch up.

Team success in the classroom continues. We've won four consecutive United Soccer Coaches Team Academic Awards, have a cumulative GPA of 3.15, placed 24 players on the Fall 2024 Dean's List, and maintained a four-year graduation rate. We now roster about 55 guys both varsity and junior varsity.

On the field, and following a series of successful seasons, the 2024 campaign finished in frustrating fashion. Despite a great start to North Coast Athletic Conference (NCAC) play (a 1-1 tie at Ohio Wesleyan University, and a 4-0 win at The College of Wooster), a series of injuries dramatically altered our competitiveness down the stretch. Still, a talented senior class kept the team together and focused.

It's worth noting that the conference placed four of nine teams into the NCAA Tournament this fall. Based upon the overall strength of schedule, winning percentage, and post-season performance, the NCAC now ranks among the best leagues in the country. (Perennial powerhouse John Carroll University is moving into the NCAC beginning next fall).

Our primary focus during the offseason is in the weight room. But the guys also run their own Futsal league and have access to The Steemer. Our nontraditional season kicks off in March.

Please know your connection to Wittenberg and the men's soccer program is highly valued. We look forward to seeing you around campus and perhaps at a road game close to your home. If you ever need anything, please don't hesitate to ask.

The concept of working hard to improve skills and build a teammentality stands out as a very potent weapon to succeed in many facets of life.
