Second Harvest Food Bank is committed to compassion for those suffering from food insecurity and their mission is to alleviate hunger in Clark, Champaign, and Logan Counties. They source and distribute nutritious food to people in need, build community partnerships, and mobilize the public to support hunger relief. Their 62,000 square foot warehouse is the primary hub for their 65+ distribution partners and they have a series of direct programs that distribute food to those people who need it such as: homeless, disabled, elderly, children, etc. Volunteer opportunities range from packing boxes and sorting products to home delivery ride along or distributing food to neighbors.

The **Hagen Center's Civic Internship Program** helps students develop skills and knowledge to be active and engaged citizens while preparing them for success in their future careers. It is also important to the program that we support the mission and day-to-day work of our community organizations.

We look forward to receiving proposals from a variety of community organizations and increasing the number of students who apply for these internships. **Our goal this year is to have at least 20 interns hired by 20 different community organizations.** Interns are paid through Wittenberg student employment (we anticipate the wage will be at least \$10.60 per hour) and housed on campus.
