Faculty Recognitions



The Tigers next head into NCAA Division III Tournament play. The Tiger women's soccer team also put together a string of five straight matches without a loss to reach the NCAC Tournament title game, much like the Tiger field hockey team, which won three straight games to close the regular season and advance to the NCAC Tournament. Lastly, the Tiger football team is currently in a three-way tie for first place in the league standings heading into the regular season finale on Saturday, Nov. 10.
