 - EXPR 100 as a Professional Development (versus Employment) Answer from last week:
 - EXPR-100 was approved with four categories of experiential learning, which have been denoted as EXPR-100L (leadership), EXPR-100R (mentored research), EXPR 100-S (study away), and EXPR-E (on-campus employment). While these categories have been sufficient for the majority of experiences proposed thus far, we are seeing more opportunities that are difficult to classify using the existing categories. A fifth category called "professional development" (denoted as EXPR-100P) would help acknowledge and encourage the development of (or the approval of existing) valuable experiential learning opportunities that are related to a student's potential career interests, which are not easily captured using the existing categories. Examples include structured job shadowing opportunities, substantive volunteer work with or at a professional conference/convention, unpaid on-campus experiences that help students gain particular professional skills, and others. As with all EXPR-100 experiences, there still would need to be an on-campus faculty or staff supervisor even if the experience takes place off campus. On-campus employment still would use the E (employment) designation, even if it also provides some professional development benefits.
