A transformational administrator, respected scholar, author, and ordained Episcopal priest, Dr. Brady began his tenure as the 16th president of Wittenberg University on June 1, 2025. The former T. W. Lewis Dean of the Lewis Honors College at the University of Kentucky, who also previously led the Schreyer Honors College at The Pennsylvania State University, Dr. Brady brings a wealth of executive leadership experience and a deep commitment to student success.

An expert in Hebrew and Jewish literature, Dr. Brady holds a bachelor's degree from Cornell University, a master's degree from Wheaton College Graduate School in Illinois, and a doctorate from the University of Oxford. Elizabeth Brady, Christian's wife, is an author, an associate teaching professor of communication arts and sciences at The Pennsylvania State University, and a public relations consultant for Penn State Global. Their daughter Isabel is completing her doctorate in Medieval Art History at Florida State University. Their son Mack died unexpectedly in 2012, just two weeks shy of his 9th birthday. Together, they continue to participate in the bereaved parent community through service and writing.
